1. **Identification/ Intervention-** Middletown Fire Chief Paul Lolli-spokesman

Data base of users-to be shared with all groups, police and courts.

Primary goal-est. short term data base

Mental Health/ADAS- bring both together. To identify users to get them into treatment. Who pays- find group to provide funding. Privacy issues? Legislature, Atty. General-may take time. Est. a drug czar-a person who is local, who knows all points of the system. Hot spots- Important- intervention needs to be 24/7-365 day availability. Must protect the data base.

Develop a response team- a window of opportunity to reach people!

Data base needs to be out of PD, not hospital (HIPPA).
